COURSE OBJECTIVES/GENERAL INFORMATION

This program is designed for healthcare professionals who provide patient care at all levels in transplantation. The course is designed for, but not limited to, surgeons, hepatologists, nephrologists, nurses, social workers and pharmacists.

The University of Colorado faculty and guest speakers will address topics on kidney transplantation, immunosuppression and allocation, living donor liver transplant and clinical experience with MELD (Model for End-Stage Liver Disease) scoring system. Other topics will include hepatitis C, patient management, and issues of financing in transplantation.

At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

1. Evaluate current issues regarding living donor liver transplant.
2. Evaluate MELD scoring systems.
3. Assess issues with transplant complications.
4. Analyze strategies for transplant reimbursement.

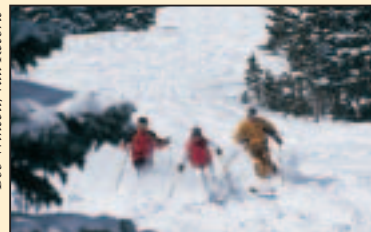

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Hepatology Young Investigators Forum

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Deadline date: December 31, 2004

The University of Colorado School of Medicine invites you to participate in the "Hepatology Young Investigators Forum," March 3rd, 2005, in Colorado. This meeting will be held in conjunction with the ***Controversies in Transplantation*** meeting March 4th-6th in Breckenridge. Please submit your original research in either basic or clinical science. Priority will be given to abstracts focusing on Hepatitis C pathobiology and clinical impact in relation to immunosuppression, immunopharmacology, transplantation, end-stage liver disease, or end-stage renal disease.

Objectives for the Young Investigators Forum include:

- * Establish a forum where research trainees orally present their original research in an adjudicated and instructional environment
- * Afford young investigators an opportunity to meet and exchange ideas with peers in hepatology research
- * Augment the ***Controversies in Transplantation*** meeting with abstracts presented by research trainees, and encourage future participation and support

The top 20 abstracts will be selected by an expert panel. The Fellows who authored these abstracts will make 15-minute oral presentations, or present posters of the research.

Travel, room expenses, and registration for the ***Controversies in Transplantation*** CME program will be provided for all selected abstracts, and covered by a generous, unrestricted educational grant from Amgen.

Awards will be given for the top presentations.
