GENERAL INFORMATION

The Fall session of the 52nd FAMILY MEDICINE REVIEW features five days of teaching by carefully chosen faculty members of the University of Colorado School of Medicine. This exciting course is designed to provide a comprehensive overview of important issues and recent developments in patient management facing the primary care physician and allied health professionals in clinical practice today.

The course is not designed primarily as preparation for the American Board of Family Medicine examination, but many physicians have found it useful for this purpose. Topics emphasized in this year's "Maintenance of Certification" of the American Board of Family Medicine will be featured. Topics will be indicated by an *.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

After attending this course, the participants should be able to describe and apply recent advances in the management of:

1. Congestive heart failure and coronary artery disease
2. Depression and bipolar disorder
3. Ear, nose and throat and oral disorders
4. Low back pain and other orthopaedic problems
5. Update on office dermatology, gynecology, and infectious diseases

WORKSHOPS

Most workshops will be repeated, affording an opportunity for each registrant to participate in ten workshops. Credit hours will be provided based on Self-Reporting Certificates participants receive with their packets at registration. Enrollment in all workshops will be limited to facilitate better interaction with faculty, and will be assigned according to the preferences indicated on a first-come, first-served basis.

ACCREDITATION

HIGH ALTITUDE TIPS

To minimize or avoid the effects of high altitude:

- Increase your water consumption. Use a water bottle so you have water handy during walks between venues and so forth.
- Go easy on alcohol; high altitude can heighten the effects of alcohol, smoking and tranquilizers.
- Pace yourself. Don't overexert. If you tire more easily than usual, take a brief rest. Use judgment in engaging in moderate or intense levels of exercise until acclimatized.
- Check with your physician about the use of acetazolamide in preventing altitude sickness or any other issues you may have.
