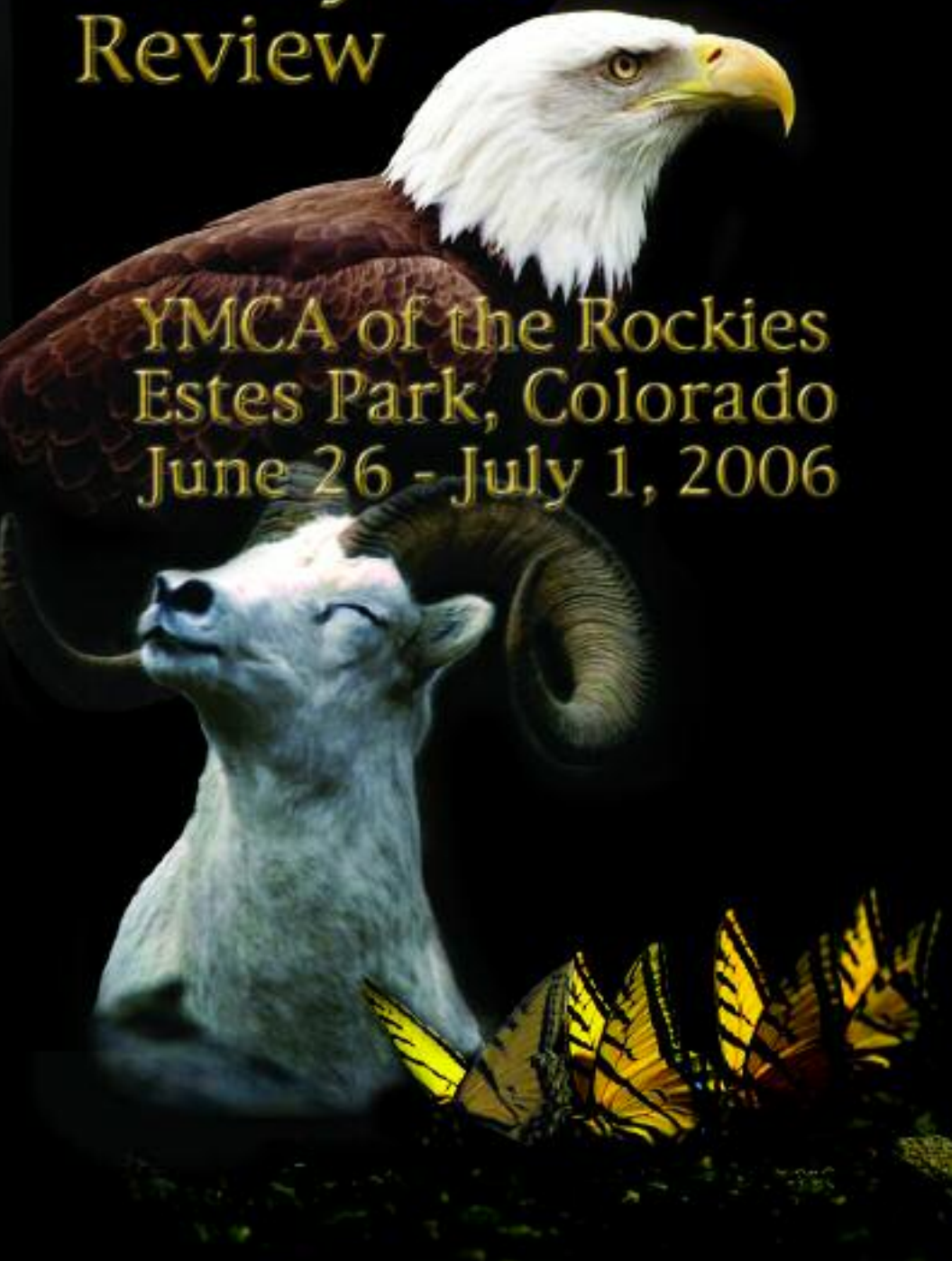

General Information

The June session of the 52nd FAMILY MEDICINE REVIEW (formerly known as the Family Practice Review) features five days of teaching by carefully chosen faculty members of the University of Colorado School of Medicine, designed to provide information on recent developments in patient management of interest to primary care physicians and allied health professionals.

The course will be repeated November 6-10, 2006 at the University of Colorado School of Medicine in Denver, Colorado.

The course is not designed primarily as preparation for the American Board of Family Medicine examination but many physicians have found it useful for this purpose. Topics emphasized in this year's "Maintenance of Certification" of the American Board of Family Medicine will be featured. Topics will be indicated by an *.

Learning Objectives

After attending this course, the participants should be able to describe and apply recent advances in the management of:

1. Congestive heart failure and coronary artery disease
2. Depression and bipolar disorder
3. Ear nose and throat and oral disorders
4. Low back pain and other orthopaedic problems
5. Updates on office dermatology, gynecology, and infectious diseases

Workshops

Approximately one-half the schedule is devoted to "workshops" of 1.5 hours each, bringing together a faculty member and 20-40 registrants, encouraging personal interchanges. Most workshops will be repeated, affording an opportunity for each registrant to participate in ten workshops. Enrollment in all workshops will be limited to facilitate better interaction with faculty, and will be assigned according to the preferences indicated on a first-come, first served basis. Please sign up for the Workshops of your choice to assure availability (see registration form).

Accreditation

The University of Colorado School of Medicine is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

The University of Colorado School of Medicine designates this educational activity for a maximum of 34.5 AMA PRA Category I Credits™. Physicians should only claim credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

American Osteopathic Association credit may be claimed up to 29.5 Category 2A hours.

Application for CME credit has been filed with the American Academy of Family Physicians. Determination of credit is pending.

Estes Park

Estes Park is located 65 miles northwest of Denver at an altitude of 8,000 feet. You may fly into Denver International Airport, arrange for a rental car, and drive to Estes Park; or check below for shuttle service. It is approximately an hour and half drive via Interstate 25 north from Denver to Colorado 66 West (Exit No. 243) to Lyons, and Colorado 36 to Estes Park or Interstate 25 north from Denver to Colorado Hwy 34 to Estes Park. Exit 257B follow Hwy 34 into Estes Park, go through town and at the 4th stop light turn to Hwy 36 going toward Rocky Mountain National Park. The turn for the YMCA is one street pass the turn light on Colorado Hwy 66. The YMCA is approximately two miles on the right side.

Weather

Colorado weather features warm days, cool evenings and occasional late afternoon showers so pack clothing that is suitable for these weather changes and do not forget good walking shoes. Mountain temperatures range between 55-85 degrees. Casual wear is appropriate and encouraged. Water, sunglasses, hats and sun block are advised.

High Altitude Tips

- ◆ To minimize or avoid the effects of high altitude:
- ◆ Increase your water consumption. Use a water bottle so you have water handy during walks between venues and so forth.
- ◆ Go easy on alcohol; high altitude can heighten the effects of alcohol, smoking and tranquilizers.
- ◆ Pace yourself. Don't overexert. If you tire more easily than usual, take a brief rest. Use judgment in engaging in moderate or intense levels of exercise until acclimatized.
- ◆ Check with your physician about the use of acetazolamide in preventing altitude sickness or any other issues you may have.
