GENERAL INFORMATION

General Information
The June session of the 51st ANNUAL FAMILY PRACTICE MEDICINE REVIEW features five days of teaching by carefully chosen faculty members of the University of Colorado School of Medicine, designed to provide information on recent developments in patient management of interest to primary care physicians and allied health professionals.

The course will be repeated October 31-November 4, 2005 at the University of Colorado School of Medicine in Denver, Colorado, 9th Ave.

The course is not designed primarily as preparation for the American Board of Family Practice examination but many physicians have found it useful for this purpose. There is an emphasis on diabetes and hypertension in keeping with the current testing for Maintenance of Certification in those topics.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Learning Objectives
After attending this course, the participants should be able to describe and apply recent advances in the management of:

1. Diabetes and its complications;
2. Hypertension and its complications;
3. Selected gastrointestinal disorders and issues;
4. Dermatologic, cardiologic, and infectious disorders;
5. Conditions requiring office gynecology and orthopaedics.

WORKSHOPS

Workshops
Approximately one-half the schedule is devoted to "workshops" of 1.5 hours each, bringing together a faculty member and 15-30 registrants, encouraging personal interchanges. Most workshops will be repeated, affording an opportunity for each registrant to participate in ten workshops. Enrollment in all workshops will be limited to facilitate better interaction with faculty, and will be assigned according to the preferences indicated on a first-come, first served basis.
