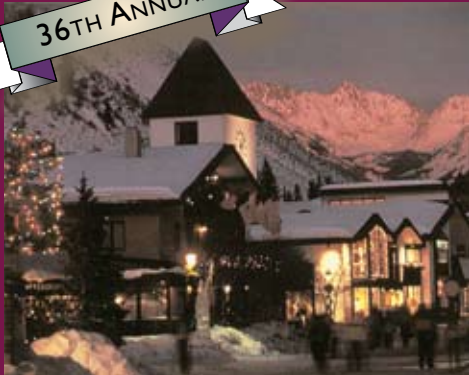

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Goal: To provide up-to-date, state-of-the-art information on recent advances in the fields of obstetrics, gynecology, gynecologic surgery, perinatal medicine and primary care to obstetricians, gynecologists, primary care physicians, nurses and allied health professionals. 3. The percentage of patients evaluated for an asymptomatic pelvic mass who receive a transvaginal ultrasound examination. (ACOG PB#83, July 2007)
4. The percentage of women with diagnosed symptomatic pelvic organ prolapse who are offered pessary use as first-line treatment. (ACOG PB#85, September 2007)

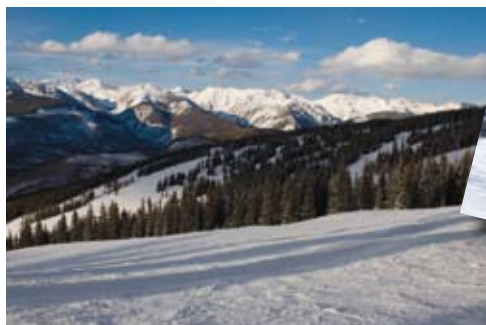
