## COURSE OBJECTIVES/GENERAL INFORMATION

*Objectives:* At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

1. Assess the risks and benefits of commercial transplants.
2. Evaluate the impact of extended donor criteria on the transplant waiting list.
3. Analyze immunosuppression strategies.
4. Assess complications in LDLT (live donor liver transplant).

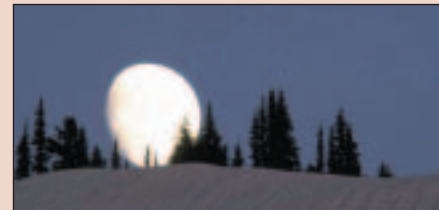
