ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Goal:

To provide up-to-date, state-of-the-art information on recent advances in the fields of obstetrics, gynecology, gynecologic surgery, perinatal medicine and primary care to obstetricians, gynecologists, primary care physicians, nurses and allied health professionals. 4. Among women with bladder pain, know how to distinguish interstitial cystitis from urinary tract infection.
5. After a delivery, know when cord blood gasses should be obtained.

Proposed Performance Measures:

1. The percentage of women who are positive for Group B streptococci at the 35 to 37 week rectal vaginal culture and receive intrapartum prophylaxis to prevent to Group B streptococcal neonatal sepsis.
2. The percentage of women in preterm labor at 24 to 34 weeks who receive corticosteroids to accelerate fetal lung maturity.
3. The percentage of females 9 through 26 years old who are counseled about the HPV vaccine to prevent cervical cancer.
4. The percentage of women over the age of 40 who have had a mammogram within the last 2 years.
