General Information

The Western States Rhinology Course will provide a comprehensive update on the practice of medical and surgical rhinology. We are privileged to welcome Dr. Aldo Stamm as our featured guest of honor in addition to other notable leaders in the field of rhinology.

This course will feature two and one-half days of presentations, discussions and surgical demonstrations on basic and advanced topics for the practicing otolaryngologist. Surgical prosections performed by course faculty will demonstrate current endoscopic techniques. In addition, a half-day hands-on laboratory dissection utilizing state-of-the-art equipment is available to interested participants.

Course Description

This comprehensive continuing medical education program focuses on current concepts and advances in the medical and surgical management of sinus disease. A broad range of topics will be covered through an intensive didactic and interactive program.

Topics will include the current concepts in medical treatment, endoscopic surgical anatomy, the management of olfactory disease, current methods in radiological diagnosis, frontal sinus surgery, revision surgery, endoscopic surgery of the orbit and skull base, and the use of image-guided technology. An optional supervised hands-on laboratory dissection session will be offered Saturday afternoon featuring basic and advanced techniques, powered instrumentation, image-guided technology and state-of-the-art endoscopic equipment.

Target Audience is practicing otolaryngologists with an interest in rhinology and other allied health professionals in the field of otolaryngology.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

1. Describe the recent advances in the medical management of rhinosinusitis, including bacterial resistance patterns, fungal sinusitis, and nasal polyposis
2. Describe the radiographic and surgical anatomy of the paranasal sinuses and its importance in endoscopic sinus surgery
3. Summarize the application of advanced surgical techniques such as frontal sinus dissection, safe sphenoid surgery, and surgery of the orbit
4. Formulate a strategy for diagnosis and management of potential complications of sinus surgery, including orbital injury
5. Describe the new technological advances in sinus surgery such as powered instrumentation and image-guided surgery techniques
6. Explain and recognize the reasons for failure after surgical management of rhinosinusitis and develop a rational approach for revision procedures
7. Describe options for expanding the office-based practice of rhinology

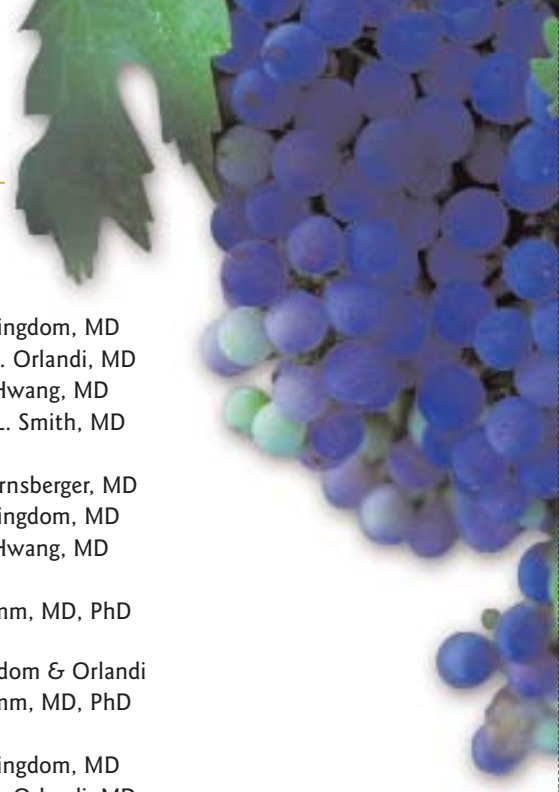
