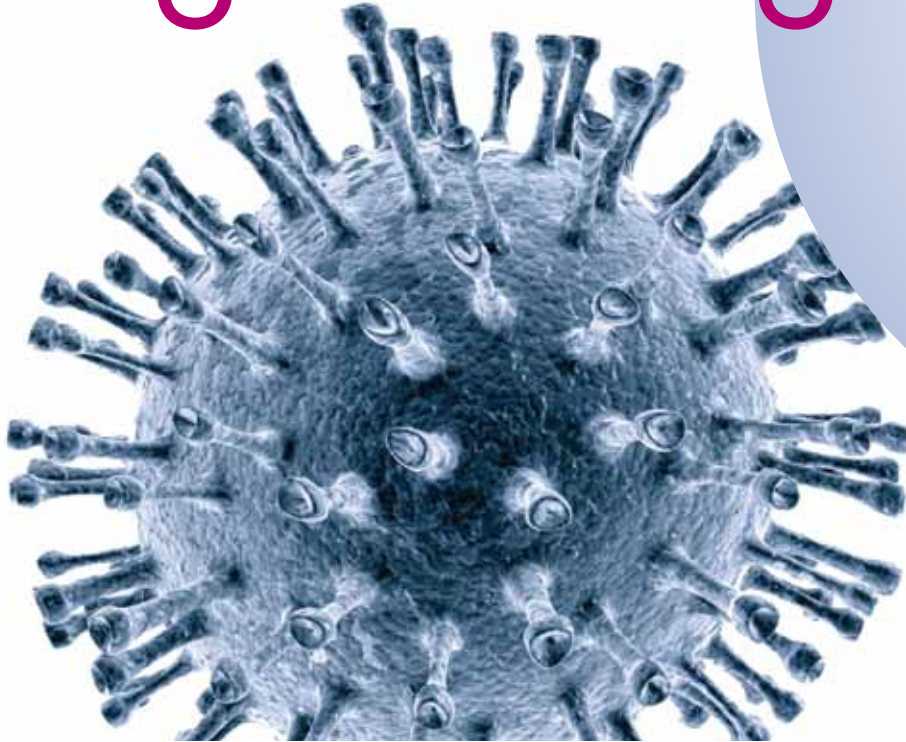

COURSE OVERVIEW

The 18th Annual Bugs and Drugs Symposium focuses on the latest diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases. This course is designed for physicians, nurse practitioners, physician's assistants, pharmacists and allied health professionals. The course includes didactic presentations with audience participation, small group lectures, and case presentations. The goal of this course is to have participants leave with new knowledge, understanding, and a skill set that will improve their clinical practice of infectious diseases.

PROGRAM FEATURES

At the conclusion of the program participants should be able to:

- Describe practical clinical management of emerging infectious disease problems, including the antiviral management of H1N1 influenza
- Review recent changes in adult and pediatric immunizations, and identify strategies to improve implementation of vaccines in routine primary care
- Identify infectious disease issues more common in certain subpopulations including children, the elderly, and pregnant patients
