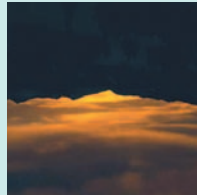

Course Overview

Join us at the Horizons in Surgery conference, designed to meet the educational needs for all Surgeons, Emergency Physicians and other allied health professionals.
