

JAMES L. BASEY

University of Colorado Distinguished Service Award

James L. Basey has been a dedicated supporter of the University of Colorado Cancer Center for many years, as well as a highly respected and generous contributor.

Mr. Basey's contributions to Colorado are legion.

A graduate of the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley and the Colorado School of Banking of the CU Graduate School of Business, Mr. Basey joined Colorado National Bank in 1970. When he retired from the bank 27 years later, he had served as senior vice president, chief financial officer, president and, in 1993, with the merger with First Bank System (now USBank), vice-chairman. He also has been chairman of the Downtown Denver Partnership Board of Directors.

In the education world, he has been a long-time member and former chairman of the University of Northern Colorado Board. His involvement with UNC spans volunteering for the Kenneth W. Monfort College of Business Advisory Board to guiding the Student and Foundation Fund class which was developed to give senior finance students the opportunity to invest approximately \$1 million on behalf of the UNC Foundation. Perhaps Mr. Basey's most significant contribution has been his service to the UNC Foundation Board Investment Committee. Under his leadership, the portfolio of \$18 million grew to nearly \$100 million in eight years and more than tripled its endowment.

In the medical arena, Mr. Basey has given much of his time and contributions not only to the CU Cancer Center but also to St. Anthony's Hospital. He currently is chairman of the CU Cancer Center's Community Advisory Board, and he is a founding member of CancerCure, a group of donors that raises money for research at the Cancer Center. At St. Anthony's, he is a member of the St. Anthony Hospital's Foundation Board of Directors and is a director of Sloan's Lake Managed Care.

In 1993, he created the Linnea J. Basey Cancer Research Endowment at the CU Cancer Center. He established the Linnea Basey Community Resource Center in 1996 at St. Anthony's Central Hospital and in 1998 at St. Anthony's North Hospital. The center is designed to help cancer patients and their families deal with the disease.

For his dedication, service and contributions to the University, the Board of Regents is proud to present James L. Basey with the University of Colorado Distinguished Service Award.

JOEL E. EDELMAN, J.D.
University of Colorado Distinguished Service Award

Since relocating from Illinois to Denver in 1979, Joel E. Edelman has continued his involvement and leadership in the healthcare field.

From 1979 to 1994, Mr. Edelman served as president and chief executive officer of Rose Medical Center. In his capacity as CEO, he worked in a liaison capacity with the leadership of the University of Colorado School of Medicine and Hospital and the Veterans Affairs Medical Center. He also directed the activities of the Rose Foundation and mobilized development efforts to raise money to support medical research and professional education.

It was while he was president and CEO of Rose Medical Center that he stepped into a leadership role to develop family medicine at the University through linkages and direct cash investments that launched serious academic development in a long-neglected discipline of critical concern to the Rocky Mountain Region. His vision of what could happen when community leadership united with university leadership reached toward future generations.

He fostered close collaboration with the School of Medicine to assist in its educational programs not only in family medicine, but also in surgery, medicine and obstetrics and gynecology. It was because of his invaluable contributions to the Department of Family Medicine that the department and the Williams Family Foundation of Fort Morgan created the Green-Edelman Chair of Family Medicine to honor him.

From 1994 to 1999, Mr. Edelman's primary involvement was to provide administrative and fund-raising services to the AMC Cancer Research Center, a private scientific enterprise affiliated with the CU School of Medicine and its CU Cancer Center. In addition, advisory services were provided to HealthONE Systems and to other healthcare organizations in the area of health manpower, particularly pertaining to nursing personnel.

More recently, Mr. Edelman has been invaluable in assisting the CU School of Medicine in its efforts to mobilize community support for the move to Fitzsimons.

He currently is president of Joel Edelman and Associates, a healthcare consulting firm he founded. And he has served as a board member of the Denver Chamber of Commerce, the National Cancer Prevention Fund and other civic and charitable organizations.

For his decades of leadership and service to the University, the Denver community and the state of Colorado, the Board of Regents is pleased to present Joel E. Edelman with the University of Colorado Distinguished Service Award.

DAVID N. CAMPBELL, M.D.
Joseph Addison Sewall Award

For more than 25 years, David N. Campbell, M.D., has given his talent, dedication, enthusiasm and commitment to many leadership roles.

Early in his career, Dr. Campbell served as chief of cardiothoracic surgery at the Denver Veterans Affairs Medical Center and as the surgical director of the pediatric intensive care unit at the University of Colorado Hospital.

Today, he is a professor in the CU Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery, interim head of pediatric cardiac surgery, and the first and only surgical head of the heart transplant programs at both UCH and The Children's Hospital. He is, in fact, a tireless member of the transplant team. He is always available when needed and virtually held together the pediatric heart transplant program when he was the only attending physician, taking call 24 hours a day, seven days a week for extended periods of time.

Dr. Campbell played the key surgical role in establishing and maintaining the notably successful adult cardiac transplant program at the UCH. In addition, he was responsible for introducing a mechanical cardiac assistance program at the hospital. These programs have tremendously benefited the city and state because they are the only such programs in the region.

He also started the pediatric cardiac transplant program at The Children's Hospital. Since he started this program, Dr. Campbell has remained the workhorse behind its success for more than a decade. It is due to his selfless efforts that this program has achieved international recognition as one of the world's leaders in pediatric and neonatal heart transplantation.

Dr. Campbell is dedicated to student and resident teaching. He is highly respected by those he teaches, as exemplified by his receiving the Gold Apple Teaching Award in Surgery. He is admired for his unflinching commitment to the highest standards of care and ethical behavior with each physician and healthcare provider he has trained and with each patient.

Perhaps Dr. Campbell's greatest attribute is his tendency to credit others for the things for which he is actually responsible. He never asks for recognition, instead deriving personal satisfaction from helping others to succeed, whether they be students, colleagues or patients.

For his selfless dedication, contributions and leadership to the University and the state, David N. Campbell, M.D., is a worthy recipient of the Joseph Addison Sewall Award.

VINCENT A. FULGINITI, M.D.
Joseph Addison Sewall Award

There are three accomplishments that stand out during the five years that Vincent A. Fulginiti, M.D., served as chancellor of the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center. He stepped down as chancellor in 1998 and then served as a professor in the CU Departments of Pediatrics and of Preventive Medicine and Biometrics until 2002.

First, Dr. Fulginiti was the driving force behind completion of the formal affiliation agreement between the CU-Health Sciences Center and The Children's Hospital. The idea was not new, but Dr. Fulginiti, from his positions as UCHSC chancellor and as a member of Children's Board of Directors, led the effort to craft the final document. The affiliation agreement was approved by the CU Board of Regents and Children's Board of Directors in 1996.

Second, Dr. Fulginiti saw clearly that the Eighth Avenue and Colorado Boulevard campus would not long accommodate the needs of a vital, growing health sciences center. He brought vision, focus and energy to the task of persuading CU and its leadership, the Colorado Legislature, the U.S. Department of Defense and Congress of the wisdom of using 217 acres of what had been Fitzsimons Army Medical Center as a new campus for the UCHSC.

Third, and still ongoing, is his commitment to raising the profile of the ethical implications of health care.

During his tenure as chancellor, Dr. Fulginiti was instrumental in establishing several campus-wide research and education initiatives. These included the Center for Aging, the Center for Bioethics and Humanities, the Human Medical Genetics Program and interprofessional education. Each of these programs has contributed to the patient care, research and education missions of the University.

Whether it is influential board members of the UCH or generous donors to the UCHSC, Dr. Fulginiti has successfully created a core of community champions and ambassadors. Their efforts, in turn, have served to enhance and advance the work of the faculty, thereby improving the education of our students and the care of our patients.

For his leadership, contributions and commitment to the University, Vincent A. Fulginiti, M.D., is a worthy recipient of the Joseph Addison Sewall Award.

BORIS TABAKOFF, Ph.D.
Florence Rena Sabin Award

Following a distinguished term as director of the intramural program at the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism, Boris Tabakoff, Ph.D., took the position in 1990 of professor and chairman of the Department of Pharmacology at the University of Colorado School of Medicine.

During his tenure as chairman, Dr. Tabakoff has raised what was already an excellent department to one of the top pharmacology departments in the country. For several years, the pharmacology department was rated first nationally in terms of National Institutes of Health funding; it currently is in the number three position. This distinction is due, in large part, to Dr. Tabakoff's faculty recruiting efforts.

He also has been instrumental in creating multidisciplinary programs within the CU-Health Sciences Center, which are, in part, based on these faculty recruitments. These include the molecular structure program and bioinformatics.

In addition, Dr. Tabakoff has obtained extensive funding from NIAAA to enhance support of the UCHSC Gene Array Facility. He also is a founding member of the NIAAA-sponsored Integrative Neuroscience Initiative on Alcoholism, which is providing both financial and scientific support for faculty members in several UCHSC departments.

In addition to his role as department chairman, Dr. Tabakoff has taken a leadership role within the UCHSC, serving on and heading numerous committees responsible for critical decisions regarding resource allocation, promotion and tenure criteria, salary structure and other policies that are integral to the future of the Health Sciences Center. He has exerted an enormous effort in planning the move of the campus to Fitzsimons, and he also has been instrumental in implementing strategic planning for the CU School of Medicine to allow for its continued success as a research, clinical and educational entity.

He is an advocate for graduate education on the UCHSC campus. He recently developed a plan by which the basic science departments can financially support the biomedical sciences graduate program.

In addition to his active involvement on CU School of Medicine committees, Dr. Tabakoff belongs to numerous scientific societies and plays active roles on dozens of national and international committees.

For his significant contributions to the success and growth of the CU-Health Sciences Center, particularly as an academic institution, Boris Tabakoff, Ph.D., is a worthy recipient of the Florence Rena Sabin Award.

BEN NIGHTHORSE CAMPBELL

University of Colorado Health Sciences Center Alumni Legislative Recognition Award

Senator Ben Nighthorse Campbell (R-Colorado) has served the people of Colorado for more than 20 years.

Elected to the Colorado Legislature in 1982 and the United States House of Representatives in 1986, he was elected to the United States Senate in 1992 and again in 1998. He is the only American Indian presently serving in the U. S. Senate, and one of 44 chiefs of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe at the Capitol.

He serves or has served on the Appropriations, Energy and Natural Resources, Environment and Public Works and Veterans' Affairs Committees. He is vice chairman of the Indian Affairs Committee.

Senator Campbell has long been a friend of the University of Colorado and its greatest champion regarding the new Fitzsimons campus in Aurora. He has worked tirelessly to help secure funding for the Fitzsimons campus and the programs of the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center.

For being a strong advocate for the Health Sciences Center, particularly its move to Fitzsimons, Senator Ben Nighthorse Campbell is a worthy recipient of the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center Alumni Legislative Recognition Award.

DIANA DEGETTE, J.D.

University of Colorado Health Sciences Center Alumni Legislative Recognition Award

Representative Diana DeGette (D-Colorado) has served the people of Colorado for ten years.

Elected to the Colorado House of Representatives in 1992, she is currently serving her third term in the United States House of Representatives. She serves on the House Energy and Commerce Committee where she has championed legislation improving health care for children. Additionally, she also has worked diligently on diabetes and patient safety issues. UCHSC applauds Diana DeGette and her work with UCHSC in developing an important clinical trials bill which further ensures the safety of all patients.

GAYLE A. BERRY

University of Colorado Health Sciences Center Alumni Legislative Recognition Award

A Colorado native and a graduate of Mesa State College, Representative Gayle A. Berry (R-Grand Junction) was first elected to the Colorado House of Representatives in 1996. She currently serves on the powerful Joint Budget Committee and is the vice chairman of the House Appropriations Committee.

Representative Berry has been a strong supporter of the University of Colorado and higher education for several years. This year, she helped champion much-needed funding for the CU-Health Sciences Center. As a member of the JBC, she was instrumental in funding UCHSC's Doctor of Pharmacy program and other CU programs.

For being a strong advocate for the CU-Health Sciences and higher education in Colorado, Representative Gayle A. Berry is a worthy recipient of the UCHSC Alumni Legislative Recognition Award.

STEVEN R. MOSTOW, M.D.
Chancellor's Special Recognition Award

As Associate Dean for Outreach for the University of Colorado School of Medicine, Steven R. Mostow, M.D., led the University's ongoing efforts to support healthcare providers and community needs in underserved areas of Colorado.

He flew faculty and administrators to the far reaches of the state to support not only community health needs, but also the needs of rural physicians who could not take time away from busy practices to attend continuing medical education courses in larger metro areas.

The position gave him the opportunity to combine two of his greatest passions: flying and rural health care. Dr. Mostow died March 24, 2002, when the plane he was piloting crashed near Centennial Airport in Douglas County.

Dr. Mostow, a professor, was known to have a rare ability to talk simply about complex medical issues, and often he was a support for rural doctors across the region, taking calls on weekends and nights to help with difficult cases.

With his help, more than 52 Colorado communities, ranging from towns with 1,100 people or fewer to larger cities like Pueblo and Grand Junction, were targeted for visits by healthcare teams. Since the outreach teams began 11 years ago, faculty members and administrators have visited nearly every hospital, county health department, county nursing service, health clinic, mental health center and Indian Health Service in the state.

Dr. Mostow was nationally recognized as an expert in preventing influenza and other infectious diseases. He led a coalition to prevent the disease and used unique techniques - such as providing immunizations in grocery stores, pharmacies and senior centers - to increase the number of people receiving flu shots. The model now is used in more than 180 U.S. cities and in several foreign countries.

He joined the CU School of Medicine faculty in 1976. In the ensuing years, he also served as chief of the infectious diseases divisions of the Veterans Affairs Medical Center and Denver Health Medical Center. He also had served as chairman of the Department of Medicine at Rose Medical Center, as director of the Sexually Transmitted Disease Clinic at the CU-Health Sciences Center and on the board of directors of the National Foundation for Infectious Diseases.

For his determination, enthusiasm and dedication, Steven R. Mostow, M.D., is a worthy recipient, posthumously, of the Chancellor's Special Recognition Award.

ACADEMIC DRESS

The tradition of the academic costume apparently began during the twelfth or thirteenth century in the early European universities. Since the clergy comprised the majority of the educated class, academic dress is an adaptation of the cope or mantle, which was usually silk or wool, and worn by church dignitaries in religious processions.

Through the years, great diversity developed in color and in style of cap, gown and hood. In 1896, the colleges and universities in the United States adopted a uniform code governing academic dress.

While it is not apparent to the observer, the gowns worn by the recipients of the various degrees vary somewhat in design. The sleeves of the gown worn by the baccalaureate candidate are long and pointed while the sleeves of the gown worn by the master's degree recipient are square at one end with a slit at the elbow. The doctor's gown has flowing sleeves with three bars of velvet and a facing of velvet down the front of the gown.

Those who are receiving a master's or doctor's degree from the University of Colorado wear hoods lined with the school colors, silver and gold. The hood worn by the doctor's candidate differs in design from that of the master's as it has side panels and is slightly longer. The velvet border of the hood

indicates the degree and usually follows the same code as the color of the tassels.

The oxford cap, usually referred to as a mortar board, has a long tassel which is fastened by a button on the top. The color of the tassel on the cap indicates the field of study.

THE NORLIN CHARGE TO GRADUATES

(From the Baccalaureate address by President George Norlin of the University of Colorado, June 1935)

"You are now certified to the world at large as alumni of the University. She is your kindly mother and you her cherished sons and daughters.

"This exercise denotes not your severance from her, but your union with her. Commencement does not mean, as many wrongly think, the breaking of ties and the beginning of a life apart. Rather it marks your initiation in the fullest sense into the fellowship of the University, as bearers of her torch, as centers of her influence, as promoters of her spirit.

"The University is not the campus, not the building on the campus, not the faculties, not the students of any one time-not one of these or all of them. The University consists of all who come into her and go forth from her halls, who are touched by

her influence and who carry on her spirit. Wherever you go, the University goes with you. Wherever you are at work, there is the University at work.

"What the University purposes to be, what it must always strive to be, is represented on its seal, which is stamped on your diplomas-a lamp in the hands of youth. If its light shine not in you and from you, how great is its darkness! But if it shine in you today, and in the thousands before you, who can measure its power?

"With hope and faith, I welcome you into the fellowship. I bid you farewell only in the sense that I pray you may fare well. You go forth, but not from us. We remain, but not severed from you. God go with you and be with you and us."
