

GRADUATE ADMISSION APPLICATION

All applications, transcripts, and supporting credentials are to be forwarded directly to the Program in Molecular Biology at the University of Colorado Denver School of Medicine, P.O. Box 6511, MS 8122, Aurora, CO 80045. All correspondence in reference to your application is to be sent to the same address, or to jean.sibley@ucdenver.edu.

The Molecular Biology Program will not consider applications for admission until all application materials, including letters of recommendation, transcripts, and GRE scores have been received by the program. Applications and credentials submitted for admission become the permanent property of the University.

1. Please follow these instructions when completing the form:
 - a. Give full name, including former names under which materials pertinent to this application maybe found.
 - b. Social Security numbers are used for record keeping and identification of students.
 - c. Do not disregard any part of your previous record.
 - d. Be sure to sign the application.
2. Recommendations may now be requested and completed on-line by your recommenders; just follow the instructions in the on-line application. It is important that those recommending you evaluate your competence and potential as a graduate student, and that they be advised of the proper department or program to which you are applying. If you prefer, you may download the Request for Recommendation form and provide it to your recommender for a paper recommendation to be sent.
3. Request that two official copies of your transcript(s) from each college or university you have attended be sent directly to the department to which you are applying for admission. (Transcripts should not be sent to the Graduate School or the Office of Admissions.) While credits from one institution may appear on the transcript of a second institution, transcripts must be submitted from all institutions where credit has been earned.
4. The application deadline is January 1, but applications will be considered as early as December 15th. You may, of course, submit your application at any time prior to those dates.
5. Scores of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) are required, as well as a TOEFL score for international students. Allow ample time for scores to be delivered after taking exam.
6. All students accepted to the Molecular Biology Program are awarded a \$25,000 annual stipend. In addition, tuition, health insurance, and fees are covered by the program. Additional financial aid is available through the Financial Aid Office.

7. Applicants submitting supplementary materials to support their applications are requested to clearly mark the materials indicating name and student number, contents, and purpose for which submitted. In addition, sufficient postage must be included if the materials are to be returned to the applicant.
