

Admissions - Tuition and Expenses

Entry-Level DPT Program

Current Tuition and Fees - 2009-2010 Academic Year**:

Program is 116 credit hours, not evenly distributed by year or semester

Resident - \$368 per credit hour

Non-resident - \$820 per credit hour

Additional UC Denver Fees - 2009-2010 Academic Year**:

Matriculation fee \$140 - one-time, 1st year

Academic support services fee \$75 - each semester

Activity fee \$20 - each summer semester

Physical Therapy Program Fees - 2009-2010 Academic Year**:

Anatomy course fee \$450 - 1st & 2nd summer semesters (DPTR 5001 & DPTR 6002)

Technology Support fee \$50 - each academic year

Laboratory fee \$150 - each academic year

Learning Resource Laboratory fee \$50 - each academic year

Books per academic year (approximate cost based on an average of previous 2 years):

1st year \$2,000

2nd year \$400

3rd year \$100

Students must also have *either* UC Denver Student Health Insurance *or* comparable plan - \$2,471 or \$1,941 per/year; voluntary dental insurance \$360/year, for a 12-month policy. This is an estimated cost; actual cost will be set closer to start of term.

Students admitted into the program must submit a \$600 confirmation deposit to hold their place. This check will be applied to the first semester of the program.

Students admitted into the program must submit \$50 for a background check.

Students assessed non-resident tuition upon admission should review the requirements for establishing residency and arrange to meet these requirements in order to be assessed resident tuition after their first year.

Students are responsible for travel, housing and living expenses related to clinical education and are required to complete at least one clinical affiliation in a rural or under-served area. Clinical education costs are variable, depending on location and length of each clinical affiliation experience.
